Come out and learn to play Kickball, Badminton and Gaga Ball!</p> <p>Basic Climbing - Using the 4-H Center's 25' outdoor climbing wall, campers will learn the basics of climbing safety, equipment, bouldering, climbing, and belaying.</p> <p>Basic Horsemanship - Campers will learn the basics of horseback riding and also learn to manage and maintain a horse barn and how to provide proper horse care.</p> <p>Basketball - Campers will learn the fundamentals of basketball; improve their shooting, ball handling and footwork skills - all while having a blast shooting hoops!</p> <p>Bugged Out! - Come meet and get up close and personal with all sorts of bugs, learn what makes them tick.</p> <p>Canoeing - (swim test required) Campers will learn about paddling and water safety, the parts of the canoe / paddle, canoe types, and paddling strokes.</p> <p>Challenge Course - Campers will learn to work together in small groups to overcome various types of initiatives and challenges, using teamwork.</p> <p>Cheerleading - Campers will learn basic skills and cheers as well as build confidence to perform in front of a crowd.</p> <p>Colonial Creations – Take a step back in time while you explore some of the arts of days gone by. Learn the art of making butter, candles, and more.</p> <p>Cooking Around the World - Have fun learning new cooking techniques and eating your tasty treats!</p> <p>Counselor-in-Training - (2 period class – must be 13 by 01/01/2019) The class will teach you how to be a great future camp counselor.</p> <p>Crafting 101 - Campers will learn creative craft ideas and make crafts they can take home and share.</p> <p>CSI - Crime Scene Investigation, learn some of the tools police detectives use to solve crimes.</p> <p>Fishing - Campers will learn the basics of freshwater lake fishing and may catch a variety of species.</p> <p>Golf - Learn golfing techniques. Equipment is provided.</p>	<p>High Ropes - (2 period class – must be 12 years old) Campers will learn exercises and team work all the while learning to repel down with ropes, plus getting a great look at the world below.</p> <p>Kayaking – (swim test required) Using individual kayaks, campers will learn about paddling and water safety, the parts of the kayak, paddle, kayak types, and paddling strokes.</p> <p>Mad Scientist! - Campers will conduct various science experiments.</p> <p>Miracle Growers - Try some interesting activities that teach about horticulture and growing plants.</p> <p>Multimedia - Learn to use digital and video cameras, design and create camp news segments and camp videos.</p> <p>Outdoor Adventure - Campers will learn the basics of outdoor adventures including hiking, backpacking, camping, orienteering, knot-tying, and campsite set-up and will conduct an overnight camp-out at the 4-H Center's Far Point.</p> <p>Performing Arts - Campers will learn fundamentals of expressive arts, including drama, acting, and dance.</p> <p>Reading and Relaxation - Campers will have time to sit and relax and read a book.</p> <p>Rifery - Campers will be introduced to shooting sports and will learn about firearms safety and basic marksmanship.</p> <p>Robotics - (2 period class) Utilizing LEGO Mindstorm Robotics sets, campers will learn to use this leading edge technology.</p> <p>Small Animal Science - Campers will learn how to manage and maintain a small-animal barn and how to care for animals such as calves, goats, sheep, rabbits, dogs, and pigs.</p> <p>Swimming, Beginning - Campers will learn how to become more comfortable with the water, including how to submerge their head, water safety, the basics of flotation, and simple strokes.</p> <p>Swimming, Advanced - (swim test required) Designed for campers who feel comfortable in the water, can swim without guidance, and have already learned several strokes. Campers will learn more advanced strokes.</p> <p>Tie-Dye For - Campers will have fun learning how to design their own clothing with bright colors and patterns through tie dye.</p> <p>Volleyball - Campers will learn the fundamentals of volleyball.
